ANNUAL REPORT TO PARLIAMENT

ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT

REPORTING PERIOD: APRIL 1, 2018 TO MARCH 31, 2019

Introduction

The Access to Information Act (the "Act") provides Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or any person or corporation present in Canada a right to access information that is contained in government records.

Prince Rupert Port Authority ("PRPA") is listed under the Schedule of the Act and pursuant to section 72, has prepared its annual report on the application of the Act within the organization to be tabled in Parliament by the Minister of Transportation, the Minister responsible for Canadian Port Authorities.

PRPA is a Canadian port authority established by virtue of Letters Patent, issued by the Minister of Transportation pursuant to Section 8 of the *Canada Marine Act*.

PRPA is responsible for administering activities within the Port of Prince Rupert related to shipping, navigation, transportation of passengers and goods and the handling and storage of goods, with a mission to develop and grow the Port of Prince Rupert in a sustainable, economical, safe and environmentally sound manner.

Access to Information Program

The President and Chief Executive Officer of the Prince Rupert Port Authority is the Head of the Institution for the purpose of administering the Act. The responsibilities of the Head of the Institution under the Act have been designated to Shelby O'Brien, Vice President, Commercial and Regulatory Affairs & General Counsel (the "Delegated Head"), pursuant to the attached Delegation of Authority Order of November 1, 2018. PRPA's Access to Information and Privacy Coordinator ("ATIP Coordinator") is Nicole Murray, Commercial and Regulatory Affairs Coordinator.

Procedures and Monitoring

Procedures are in place directing all formal *Access to Information Act* Requests ("Requests") and enquiries to the ATIP Coordinator, under the supervision of the Delegated Head, who ensures that Requests are processed in accordance with the Act.

The ATIP Coordinator monitors the processing time of the Requests and reports monthly to the delegated head of the program. The ATIP Coordinator ensures that responses to Requests are handled in a timely manner, in compliance with the Act and endeavors to respond to Requests within the 30-day timeline.

Statistical Report

PRPA received four (4) formal Access to Information Request (the "Request") during the period of April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019 (the "Current Reporting Period"). One (1) Request was closed during the Current Reporting Period and three (3) Requests were carried over to the next reporting period.

PRPA's multi-year trend for Requests can be characterized by peaks and valleys; a number of reporting periods with no Requests, followed by a reporting period with several and/or complex Requests. For example, from April 2014 to March 2016 only one (1) Request was received per reporting period, but six (6) Requests were received in the April 2016 to March 2017 reporting period. In the 2017-2018 reporting period, two (2) simple requests were received, followed in 2018-2019 by the receipt of four (4) complex requests.

For the Current Reporting Period, PRPA completed its largest Request to date, completing a review of over 4400 pages or records, of which over 50% (2991 pages), were disclosed. Three (3) Requests received from a single organization were held over due the complexity of the requests, consultation requirements, and the interference with regular business operations due to the nature of the Request. PRPA has been working with the requestor to resolve the outstanding Requests.

During the current Reporting Period, PRPA received three (3) consultation requests from a federal government department. PRPA recommended the disclosure in full of the records. There were no Access to Information Requests outstanding from the previous reporting period.

Attached is the Statistical Report which provides a detailed summary of data on Requests received between April 1, 2018 and March 31, 2019.

Training

In October 2018, the Delegated Head of the institution and the ATIP Coordinator hosted a lunch and learn presentation for the organization which included information about the *Access to Information Act*, how Requests are handled by PRPA and the proposed changes to the Act currently before the Senate.

Additionally, during the Current Reporting Period one-on-one training sessions were undertaken by the ATIP Coordinator for new staff members and the summer student of the Commercial and Regulatory Affairs Department. Informal briefings and updates were provided by the ATIP Coordinator at meetings held by various departments.

Policies, Guidelines and Procedures

No new policies, guidelines or procedures related to the Act were implemented by PRPA during the reporting period.

Complaints or Audits

PRPA received no complaints, no audits were conducted, and no investigations were undertaken or concluded during the reporting period.
