

# **ANNUAL REPORT TO PARLIAMENT**

ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT

REPORTING PERIOD: APRIL 1, 2023, TO MARCH 31, 2024

#### Introduction

The Access to Information Act (the "Act") provides Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or any person or corporation present in Canada a right to access information, within the provisions of the Act, that is contained in government records.

Prince Rupert Port Authority ("PRPA") is listed in Schedule 1 of the Act, and pursuant to section 94, has prepared its annual report on the application of the Act within the organization to be tabled in Parliament by the Minister of Transportation, the Minister responsible for Canada Port Authorities.

PRPA is a Canada Port Authority established by virtue of Letters Patent, issued by the Minister of Transportation pursuant to Section 8 of the *Canada Marine Act*.

PRPA is responsible for administering activities within the Port of Prince Rupert related to shipping, navigation, transportation of passengers and goods and the handling and storage of goods, with a mission to develop and grow the Port of Prince Rupert in a sustainable, economical, safe and environmentally sound manner.

#### **Access to Information Program**

The President and Chief Executive Officer of the Prince Rupert Port Authority is the Head of the Institution for the purpose of administering the Act. The responsibilities of the Head of the Institution under the Act have been delegated to Shelby O'Brien, Vice President, Commercial and Regulatory Affairs & General Counsel (the "Delegated Head"), pursuant to the attached Delegation of Authority Order of April 20, 2023. PRPA's Access to Information and Privacy Coordinator ("ATIP Coordinator") is Bhupinder Baath, Associate Corporate Secretary and Compliance Officer.

#### **Procedures and Monitoring**

Procedures are in place directing all formal *Access to Information Act* Requests ("Requests") and enquiries to the ATIP Coordinator, under the supervision of the Delegated Head, who ensures that Requests are processed in accordance with the Act.

The ATIP Coordinator monitors the processing time of the Requests and reports monthly to the Delegated Head of the program. The ATIP Coordinator ensures that responses to Requests are in compliance with the Act, and endeavors to respond to Requests within the prescribed 30-day timeline.

As required by the Directive on Access to Information, summaries of completed Access to Information (ATI) requests are published on the Open Government portal.

#### Performance 2023-2024

PRPA received three (3) formal Access to Information Requests (the "Requests") during the period of April 1, 2023, to March 31, 2024 (the "Current Reporting Period"). Three (3) Requests were closed during the Current Reporting Period and six (6) Requests were carried over to the next reporting period, five (5) of which were carried over from more than one reporting period. Sixty-seven percent (67%) of Requests were completed during the initial legislated timeline with all records disclosed within 1 to 15 days.

PRPA's multi-year trend for Requests can be characterized by peaks and valleys; a number of reporting periods with no Requests, followed by a reporting period with several and/or complex Requests. For example, from April 2014 to March 2016 only one (1) Request was received per reporting period, but six (6) Requests were received in the April 2016 to March 2017 reporting period. In the 2017-2018 reporting period, two (2) simple requests were received, followed in 2018-2019 by the receipt of four (4) complex Requests, zero (0) in 2019-2020, with (1) Request during the 2020-2021 reporting period, (1) Request during the 2021-2022 reporting period and four (4) Requests during the 2022-2023 reporting period. Three (3) Requests were received during the Current Reporting Period.

For the Current Reporting Period, three (3) Requests, received from a single organization and outstanding from the 2019-2020 reporting period, and three (3) complex requests received in the previous reporting period were held over due to the complexity of the Requests, consultation requirements, and the interference with regular business operations due to the nature of the Request.

For the Current Reporting Period, two (2) Consultations ("Consultation Requests") were received from other Government of Canada Institutions all of which were closed during the Current Reporting Period. The two (2) Consultation Requests that were closed, were disclosed in part (100% of the Consultation Request)

Attached is the Statistical Report which provides a detailed summary of data on Requests received between April 1, 2023, and March 31, 2024.

#### **Training and Awareness**

During the Current Reporting Period informal briefings and updates were provided by the ATIP Coordinator at meetings held by various departments. Information was provided on PRPA's obligations for proactive disclosure to applicable departments.

PRPA has been actively participating in virtual training sessions put on by the Access to Information and Privacy Communities Development Office (APCDO).

PRPA has in the past successfully secured training through the Canada School of Public Service ("CSPS"). In recent attempts to register employees for training, PRPA was advised that the organization was no longer eligible to use the services of CSPS. As an organization that is subject to Requests and Consultation Requests under the Act, PRPA has been told that any relevant training for staff who are responsible for complying with these Requests is not available to them.

#### Policies, Guidelines and Procedures

No new policies, guidelines or procedures related to the Act were implemented by PRPA during the Current Reporting Period.

#### **Proactive Publication**

PRPA is a government institution for the purposes of Part 2 of Act and has a legislative requirement to publish travel and hospitality expenses as defined by section 3 of the Act. Agnes Piotrowski, Vice President of Finance is responsible for implementing proactive publication for PRPA.
